Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the September 26th meeting were distributed. One error was noted. The minutes should reflect that it was decided that meetings would be held on Thursdays, not Wednesdays.

Student's Report—Cassandra Shuker

Breast Cancer Fundraiser—each class has a candy jar in its room. Students can pay 25 cents to guess how many candies are in the jar. There is one guess per student per day. Money raised goes to breast cancer research. Students are also welcome to bring in a donation. Breast Cancer has donated pins to distribute to those who participate.

Mrs. Gotts will come in to do nails. For a \$10.00 donation, she will paint the students nails pink and add the breast cancer symbol (ribbon). All proceeds are given to Breast Cancer.

Grade 8 graduation entrance song has been picked.

Soccer has just finished and Volleyball has started. Student teachers are starting a rugby team to do scrimmages.

Principal's Report—Chris Waler (see attached)

Principal Christine Waler presented her report.

Principal's Report for School Council October 18, 2012

- **Library update:** to date, since the spring, we have spent just over \$21,000 on the library. Funds have come from both fundraising and our school budget - \$14,000 from fundraising and \$7000 from our school budget. We have had our collection analyzed and learned that we are approximately 5000 books short of where we should be for our student population. In addition, although our book collection was weeded in recent

years, it must be weeded again as it is very old. This will result in up to half of the current collection being purged. For a library (Learning Commons) to be relevant, it must have up to date and meaningful reading material. We will use all the proceeds from our magazine fundraiser to add to our book collection, particularly for intermediate students. We will also apply for grants whenever possible. We continue to encourage parents to donate a new book to our library in honour of a child's birthday or special event. Because we have put so much time and effort into updating our library, Jacob Beam was chosen for the board's Priority Library project. A qualified teacher-librarian (Denise Falk) will be at Jacob Beam every day 1, 3, 5, and 9 until the end of January. She will be working with all teachers to help them integrate the library into their daily classroom instruction. Areas of focus will be technology, e.g. podcasts, e-books, SMARTboard use, research skills, and lesson planning in a comprehensive way. We are very excited about this opportunity.

- **School Improvement Planning:** Our primary focus this year will be on providing meaningful feedback to students (and receiving it from them) on their progress related to success criteria (what makes an assignment great). We are also focused on teaching math through problem solving.
- **Breast Cancer Awareness Month:** we are having a **Pink Day** on Thursday, October 25, 2012. Students are encouraged to wear pink in support of breast cancer awareness. Every classroom will have a jar of pink candies. For 25 cents, students can guess the number of candies and win the jar. Mrs. Gotts, a parent at Jacob Beam, has volunteered to paint nails pink with a breast cancer awareness logo, for a donation of \$10 or more.
- Current student population: we currently have 269 students
- **Terry Fox** – so far, we have raised \$427. On Wednesday, October 31st, at our recognition assembly, Mrs. Waler will have a coconut crème pie thrown in her face and Mr. Millin will have a chocolate crème pie thrown in his face. There is a raffle (25 cents a ticket) to determine who will throw the pies.
- **Christmas Shoe Boxes:** Mrs. Vandekraats is organizing our annual Christmas initiative to provide shoe boxes filled with things for children in third world countries.
- **Cards by Me Fundraiser:** we are trying a new fundraiser this year: students will do Christmas/Holiday related artwork that can be made into Christmas Cards (\$20) or 2013 calendars (\$7.50). All profits will go towards buying IPADS for the school.

Mission Statement
